Photograph of the building or structure.
Legal title & description of a property—lot numbers, etc.
Title & Abstract

## **Other Tips**

Obtaining title and abstract information may be difficult for committee members to do since one must seek this information in person during normal business hours. The Indiana Historical Society has a large collection of abstracts. Sue will try to get access to these records; she has access to the appropriate people and resources. If committee members obtain basic facts, Sue can take the search further for us. She also offered to share with the committee her password at the Indiana State Library. We can go there and use their computers and research-related subscriptions at no cost. Sue further offered to get a better idea of who will give us what information.

Research notes should be in a Word document and should provide as much background as possible. Include unanswered questions, all details even if they seem insignificant, mention contradictions found during research, and give attribution for everything
